Landpower in the 2020s Challenges and Opportunities

The Australian Army Research Centre is proud to present the E.G. Keogh Visiting Chair Oration.

This year's visiting chair is Major General John Kem, the 51st Commandant of the US Army War College at Ft Leavenworth, Kansas, and in 2015, the first Provost of the newly-formed Army University which was responsible for integrating over 70 separate US Army TRADOC programs under one university system allowing soldiers to achieve valid academic credit for education and experience whilst serving.

MAJGEN Kem's oration will be on the subject of 'Landpower in the 2020s'. The General's experience as a soldier scholar, with qualifications in the fields of military and civil engineering and business, experience in armoured and airborne warfare, as well as service in multiple active-duty assignments in the US, Europe, the Middle East and Afghanistan ensures he has a wide breadth of knowledge on the application of land power at all levels.

WHAT IS THE E.G. KEOGH VISITING CHAIR?

The E.G. Keogh Visiting Chair was established by CA in 2014 and is an annual visit by a selected eminent academic in strategic or war studies designed to increase the profile of debate on land warfare issues in Australia. The Visiting Chair, through public engagement and speaking events around Australia, contributes to the rigour of debate on land warfare in the contemporary environment. It is named after Colonel Eustace Graham Keogh, founder of the Australian Army Journal.
